

In order to promote and preserve results of intellectual activity, the University of Nova Gorica has concluded an agreement with ProQuest on depositing scientific results in the ProQuest® Dissertation & Theses Global database. This is reflected in a change in the method of submitting doctoral theses to the repository of the University of Nova Gorica.

As of 21 July 2020, the doctoral dissertation will be automatically entered to the ProQuest Dissertations & Theses database, upon being submitted in the repository. The process is carried out by automatic capture of doctoral dissertations via the UNG OAI-PMH server (item 3g of the Formal Procedures for Applying and Defending a Dissertation, adopted by the Senate at its 94th session on 11 March 2020, and the Management Board at its 58th correspondence session ended on 23 March 2020).

ProQuest enables free distribution of doctoral dissertations.

The ProQuest® Dissertation & Theses Global database is used by 3,000 universities, and has more than 200 million queries per year. The database enables access to the scientific results of the final theses of postgraduate studies, and is indexed by bibliographic databases, e.g. SciFinder, MathSciNet, PsycINFO, ERIC, etc.

ProQuest enables the non-exclusive distribution of master's thesis or doctoral dissertation to authors.

Authors are entitled to a 10% royalty on the sale and use of the full text of their thesis/dissertation distributed by ProQuest. The author may withdraw his/her thesis/dissertation from the database at any time.
