Cultural History

Bachelor's Degree Programme

Duration of studies: **3 years** (180 ECTS)
Qualification title: **diplomirani zgodovinar (UN)**
(equivalent to Bachelor of Arts, B.A.)

The primary goal of the study programme is to educate professionals to perform research and specialize in the cultural sector, tourism, or other service or economic industries. Students will get acquainted with cultural history, the history of ideas and of ideology and with intellectual history.

After acquiring knowledge of the major methodologies in cultural history, students are given opportunity to enrich their horizons further by being included on ongoing concrete projects and research topics that are of relevance to both the local environment and to a more international context. Surveying the field from the viewpoint of the Slavic, Romance and Germanic cultures, this degree also recognizes the diversity of the community of Slovenes living abroad. Students undertake a mandatory two-week practical placement at a select institution in the field of cultural economics, the cultural service industry, cultural administration or in the research and development of cultural activities. The placement gains students exposure to concerns regarding cultural history, the protection of cultural heritage and the handling of documentary and archival material.

Admission Requirements

Those candidates may enroll who have gained a high-school diploma equivalent to the general matura exam, any four-year secondary school programme before 1 June 1995, a vocational matura examination from a secondary school programme in the same vocational field (Klasius-P-16 field 02: Art and the humanities; 03: Social sciences, journalism and information science; 04: Business and Administrative Sciences, Law), and those who passed an exam on the subject of History in the Matura exam. If the candidate passed the subject of History in the vocational matura examination, the candidate must also complete an exam in one of the matura subjects of geography, art history or sociology.

Slovene Studies

Bachelor's Degree Programme

Duration of studies: **3 years** (180 ECTS)
Qualification title: **diplomirani slovenist (UN)**
(equivalent to Bachelor of Arts, B.A.)

The degree aims to give students broad fundamental knowledge in the field of Slovene Studies, general linguistics and literary science. Compulsory courses building basic knowledge in the field of linguistics and literary studies are supplemented with elective courses that widen the scope of students' knowledge of their subject and that expand their awareness of interdisciplinary methods, thereby preparing them for further study and employment in their fields.

Students study literary phenomena in the Slovene region using new methods. They are encouraged to approach research topics or analytical problems independently. In addition to preparation for vocational activities in literature and language, they also gain familiarity with other academic subjects in the humanities and social science. This enables an easier transition to master's research programmes or for a degree in pedagogy or continuing education.

Admission Requirements

Those candidates may enrol who have gained a high-school diploma equivalent to the general matura exam, any four-year secondary school programme before 1 June 1995, a vocational matura examination from a secondary school programme in the same vocational field (Klasius-P-16 field 02: Art and the humanities; 03: Social sciences, journalism and information science; 04: Business and Administrative Sciences, Law), and those who passed a matura exam in one of the following subjects: history, sociology, philosophy or psychology. The chosen subject must not be the same as the one the candidate completed in the vocational matura exam.

Slovene Studies

Master's Degree Programme

Duration of studies: **2 years** (120 ECTS)

Qualification title: **magister slovenistike (equivalent to Master of Arts, M.A.)**

The two-year Master's programme in Slovene Studies is a continuation of the three-year Bachelor's programme in Slovene Studies. However, graduates in other fields of study can also enroll. It offers two course tracks: Linguistics and Literary Science. The programme's main features include independent research work, a large number of elective subjects, and the programme's embeddedness in the region. Both linguistics and literary studies can be linked while enrolled in the Master's programme in Slovene Studies.

Students gain a comprehensive education in Slovene Studies by choosing from a wide range of subjects in different disciplines. However, students aiming to pursue their studies at the doctoral level will be able to focus on only one field of study.

Course track: Linguistics

The goal of this programme is to train experts with wide-ranging insight into the linguistic sciences, with an emphasis on the scientific approach in linguistics. They will learn to approach problems and research in the field in depth as well as to solve complex issues regarding language. They will master several methods of studying linguistic phenomena and have opportunity to transfer their knowledge into practice. After completing their studies, students will be prepared to engage in independent scientific research within the broader field of linguistics or work in the high-tech industry.

Admission Requirements

To enroll, students must have completed an undergraduate study programme in the amount of at least 180 ECTS in the field of Slovene studies, comparative Slavic linguistics, general linguistics, classical philology or other humanities programmes that include contents pertaining to the field of linguistics.

Applicants with a first degree in other fields of study (180 ECTS) should send the application to the School's Student Affairs Committee.

The students of the programme in Slovene Studies – Linguistics track also have the option of pursuing **the double degree** together with the Language Sciences programme at **Ca' Foscari University of Venice**.

Course track: Literary Science

The goal of this programme is to educate experts with wide-ranging insight into literary science and emphasize research skills. Students will learn to treat problems in-depth, independently and creatively. They will not only study concrete literary phenomena, but also have a broad overview of the possibilities of transferring knowledge into practice. After completing their studies, students will have the academic training to engage in independent research as well as find employment in organizations dealing in literary matters.

Admission Requirements

To enroll, students must have completed an undergraduate (B.A.) study programme in the amount of at least 180 ECTS in the field of Slovene studies, comparative literature, classical philology or other humanities study programmes that include contents pertaining to the field of the literary sciences.

Applicants with a first degree in other fields of study (180 ECTS) should send the application to the School's Student Affairs Committee.
